### LOCAL TEACHER COMPLETES TEXT BOOK ON HISTORY

Through the courtesy of R. G. Hall, principal of the Rose school, the editor of The News has been presented with a copy of "The Students' History of Our Country, for Grammar Grades," a most valuable and comprehensive text book compiled and written by Mr. Hall, while he was superintendent of the schools at Cleburne, Texas.

This book has been adopted by the school commission of Texas, and over 65,000 have already been published. It is divided into two parts, and each of these into periods, making it possible to have events and dates easily impressed and remembered. Part one is devoted to early American history, this being subdivided into three periods, the first dealing with discovery and exploration, the second to colonization, and the third to the struggle for possession, this part bringing the student down to the end of the Revolution.

Part two embraces the United States under the Constitution, with four periods, the first of which treats of the generation of Revolution fathers, period two, with the second generation of statesmen, period three with the era of strife from 1850 to 1876, and the last period shows the re-United States brought down to the date of the election of President Wilson.

The book is profusely illustrated with maps and engravings of historical events, and notable persons, and is written in an attractive literary style, while retaining all the essential and authentic facts of history in a concise and chronological order.
