SCHOOL BOARD HOLDS MEETING

At the regular meeting of the school board held last night the plans and specifications as prepared by Architect F. Manson White for the proposed high school building were officially accepted. Several minor changes were recommended and these will be made by Mr. White who returned to Portland last night. The working plans will be made and sent to Roseburg about next Thursday and at that time bids will be advertised for.

The school board is anxious that construction work on the building be begun as soon as possible. Building materials of all kinds are advancing in price rapidly and will probably add a great deal to the amount of the engineer's estimate. It is hoped that building may be begun by the first of May and the structure rushed to an immediate construction. Many new features of modern convenience have been added to the plans and the school is one of the best equipped on the coast. One of the many pleasing features which has not been mentioned is the cork flooring which will be used in nearly all the rooms. This type of flooring is dustless, noiseless and will wear almost twice as long as the ordinary type of wooden flooring.


