## ROY GRIGGS FOR LEGISLATURE

Roy Griggs, of Comstock, Republican candidate for the nomination for representative in the legislature from Douglas county, was born at Comstock, on December 26, 1878, and he is now in his thirty-eighth year. His father, J. A. Griggs, came to Douglas county in 1875 and has been a life long republican.

Roy Griggs himself has followed his father in his political belief and has been a consistent republican.

Like many of the older settlers in this county, Roy Griggs had a hard struggle for an education. He was persistent and between the farm and the country school he worked out his early schooling both in books and hard knocks with experience and necessity. COLUMBUS, April 11.—The Mexicans are circulating false reports of the death of Villa, from wounds received at Guerrero, army aviators Dargue and Cottrell reported on arriving from the front. The report as given to the troops at Sanborja stated that Villa was dead and buried. Dargue said that officers who have been over the scene of the battle at Guerrero, believe that the bandit was shot in both legs, but they admitted perhaps the reports were inspired.

## WARN RESIDENTS OF HIGH WATER

PORTLAND, April 11.—The weather bureau has issued a warning to residents of the lowlands of the Columbia and Willamette, and the business houses along Front street, that higher water than usual is anticipated on account of the snowfall. It said the snow in the mountains was well packed, and will yield a high percentage of water. Under normal temperature, the conditions of the Columbia will be higher in April and May than usual, as the amount of snowfall is the heaviest in years.

M. on April 24th, 1916, at his office in the Roseburg National Bank Building, Roseburg, Douglas County, Oregon, for the purchase of negotiable coupon bonds of School District No. 4, Douglas County Oregon, in the sum of \$75,000.00. Said bonds are in denominations of \$500.00 each, dated May 1, 1916, due absolutely seventeen years from date and payable at the option of the Board of Directors, one-fifteenth of the principal amount of said issue on the 1st day of May, 1919 and one-fifteenth on the 1st day of May of each and every year thereafter until the entire issue is retired, draw five per cent interest semi-annually, and are payable at the option of the purchaser in Roseburg or New York. Said bids will be opened and considered by the board at a meeting to be held at 7:30 o'clock P. M. on April 24, 1916.

## 12,000 AMERICAN TROOPS IN MEXICO

WASHINGTON, April 11.—Twelve thousand American soldiers are at the present time in Mexico, officials of the war department stated today. Most of the troops are engaged in guarding the line of communication, while 18,000 more are patrolling the international border. Only 2,000 regular troops remain in the country at the present time, which number includes those stationed in Alaska. All inquiries which deal with advisability of using the state militia for border patrol purposes are referred to the president direct.

It is said that a duplication of the dish which resulted in the capture of the Indian chieftain Sauceronino will be necessary to capture Villa now.

**Travelers Denounce Carranza Troops**  
EL PASO, April 11.—The American cavalry is reported today as being at Durango, while Villa is believed to be at Tepehuatlan, about 50 miles north on the main highway leading to Durango.

Arrivals from Chihuahua brought new versions of the shooting of Villa. They declare that a Mexican peon shot him at Guerrero after he had outraged his daughter, whereupon he attempted to make his escape, but the soldiers of the bandit leader captured him and brought him before their chief who shot him on the spot.

The passengers aboard trains coming from Chihuahua declare that the Villistas have murdered several foreigners among whom were three Americans and an Englishman. The travelers strongly denounce the Carranzista troops whom they declare stepped aside and let Villa pass to safety when he could have been captured by the American troops.
