ROSEBURG TO SEE METEOR SHOWER

Roseburg people may look for the annual "shower of meteors" tonight, tomorrow night and the next night, according to announcement of astronomers. This display, it is said, will not be so brilliant as some of the preceding ones, but it will be sufficiently brilliant to be easily distinguished, six meteors an hour being visible.

The 1916 shower is known as the Lyrids, because the meteors seem to radiate from the direction of the constellation Lyra, of which Vega is the principal star. The constellation Lyra is small and triangular shaped, and the three points being easily distinguishable. At the time the meteors will appear Vega will be the brightest star in the northeast. About 9 p. m. is declared to be the best time to watch for the "shower".

A number of planets are visible and others will appear later in the month. Venus appears in the western sky during the month. Mars will be above the horizon until past midnight during the entire month, and Jupiter will appear as the morning star the latter part of April. Saturn also is visible between Venus and Mars in the constellation Gemini.

SARAH FLOWER, born at Great Harlow, England, in 1805, married William Bridges Adams, a civil engineer, in 1834, and for his sake gave up the dramatic ambitions and career to which she had looked forward.

"Nearer My God to Thee" was written by her in 1840, and first published by the Rev. William J. Fox, at London, in a Hymnal for his Church.

Later, the air to which it is now sung was adapted to it by Lowell Mason from one of Sir John Andrew Stevenson's "Irish Melodies." It will be remembered that President McKinley, just before his last farewell, said, "It is God's way. His will be done, not ours," and whispered, "Nearer, My God, to Thee," and on the Sunday following, in many churches (as on Thursday at the funeral services) this great hymn was sung by thousands, not only in Protestant churches but by Catholic cathedrals, and notably at a Memorial Service ordered by King Edward VII, in Westminster Abbey.
