GERMANY WILL SEND DYES TO AMERICA

WASHINGTON, April 21.—The German government has agreed to permit exportation to the United States of 15,000 tons of dyestuffs, lack of which has affected seriously American textile manufacturers. Notification to this effect was contained in a note delivered by Count von Bernstorff, the German ambassador, to Secretary Lansing.

The communication explains that while Germany refused at first to permit exportation of dyestuffs unless they be exchanged for American goods now excluded from Germany by the British blockade, after careful consideration of the situation it has been seen "that this blockade has resulted in serious embarrassment to those American industries which are in need of dyestuffs," and the imperial German government now is prepared to make "a single exception" in permitting exportation in this instance. It is required only that the dyestuffs shall be consumed by American manufacturers and not re-exported to Great Britain or her allies.

It is expected that the state department immediately will make representations to Great Britain to insure the safe arrival of the dyestuffs in this country.

ADELAIDE PHILLIPS AND AN OLD-TIME NEGRO MELODY

Early in 1840 a tiny English lass of seven years landed in America with her parents from Stratford-on-Avon, the historic birthplace of William Shakespeare. At the age of nine little Adelaide Phillips made her first appearance at the Tremont theatre in Boston. Jenny Lind met her and advised her to go to London, and later she studied in Italy where she won a great triumph as Arsace in "Semiramide." Returning to America she was given an ovation accorded few singers and continued her tour on to Cuba. When the Boston Ideal Opera Company was formed in 1879 she appeared in "Pinafore" and the Sullivan operas, and added greatly to her fame as one of America's most popular and beloved contralto singers. It was a memory that can never be effaced to hear Adelaide Phillips sing the old popular songs as encore after encore was demanded. To hear her sing that plaintive melody of Foster's, "Massa's in de Cold, Cold Ground," vibrated the heart chords and touched the hearts of hearers. 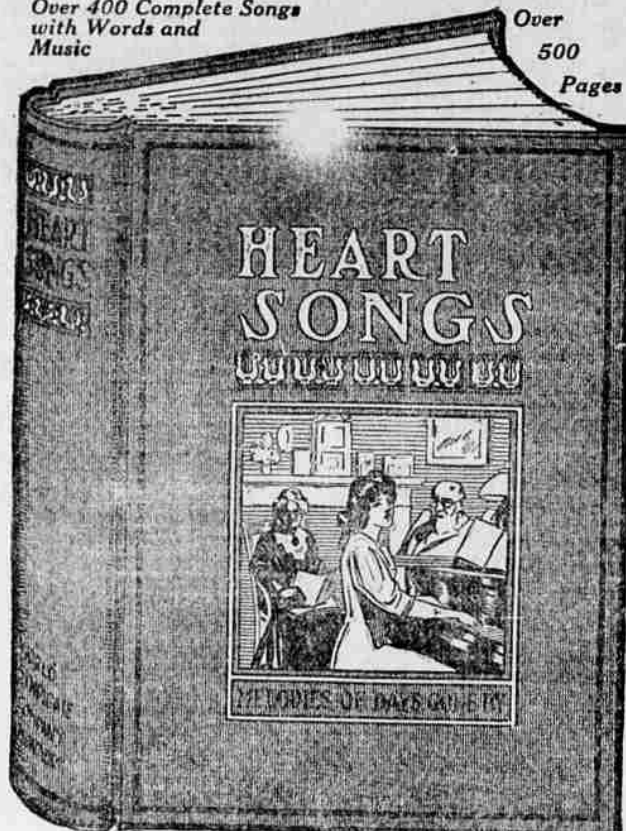

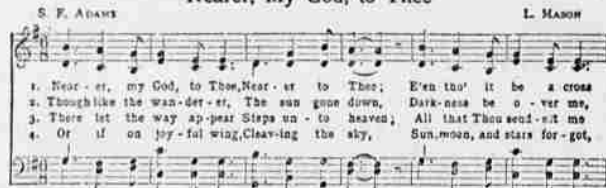

Nearer, My God, to Thee

SARAH FLOWER, born at Great Harlow, England, in 1805, married William Bridges Adams, a civil engineer, in 1834, and for his sake gave up the dramatic ambitions and career to which she had looked forward.

"Nearer My God to Thee" was written by her in 1840, and first published by the Rev. William J. Fox, at London, in a Hymnal for his Church.

Later, the air to which it is now sung was adapted to it by Lowell Mason from one of Sir John Andrew Stevenson's "Irish Melodies." It will be remembered that President McKinley, just before his last farewell, said, "It is God's way. His will be done, not ours," and whispered, "Nearer, My God, to Thee," and on the Sunday following, in many churches (as on Thursday at the funeral services) this great hymn was sung by thousands, not only in Protestant churches but by Catholic cathedrals, and notably at a Memorial Service ordered by King Edward VII, in Westminster Abbey.
