GRANTS PASS, Or., May 5.—A lumber planing mill of 60,000 feet capacity, combined with a lumber purchasing agency, is to be established along the line of the new Twoby railroad in South Grants Pass...

WALLACE, Idaho, May 11.—Nearly \$125,000 in gold was received here today to be distributed among 4000 miners in the Couer d'Alene district as a bonus for their work during the month of April.

The bonus system, adopted by the mine operators February 1, is governed by the prices of the metals produced—mostly gold, copper and silver.
