





The gifted authoress of this popular song was Mrs. Norton, a granddaughter of the famous Richard Brinsley Sheridan, born in England in 1808. Her songs of "Bingen on the Rhine" and "Juanita" were very popular. She died 1877 and lived to hear the echoes of her plaintive "Juanita" come to her from nearly every civilized country in the world.
