The armies of the Russian Grand Duke now have for their objectives Bairut (1), Erzingan (2), and Diarbekir (3). From Persia Russian forces are operating toward Mosul (4) on the Constantinople-Bagdad route, from Han (5), and against Khanikin Pass (6). The British expedition, now with Russian cavalry, reports a gain toward Kut-el-Amara (7).
