RUSHING WORK ON SCHOOL BUILDING

With a large force of men at work the new high school building is progressing rapidly. The recent bad weather delayed operations considerably and construction has just reached its normal rapidity again. The concrete foundations have nearly all been placed and the basement walls are now being built. The excavations for the gymnasium are finished and workmen are now placing drain tile to carry off the surplus water. The floor will be built on gravel with drain tile placed every few feet in order to prevent the excavation from becoming filled with water.

The footings for the balcony which slope up from within five feet of the gymnasium floor are now well set and waiting for the retaining walls and other portions of the work to be completed before the remainder of the balcony is added.

The scene is one of the greatest activity with many men and teams at work constantly. Immense quantities of sand and gravel are being used in making the concrete foundations and walls and mixing is going on constantly at many points on the grounds. Mr. Hunter, the contractor, is anxious to have the building under cover before the autumn rains set in and is employing as many men as possible. As soon as the work on the superstructure begins much more rapid progress can be made, it is thought.

Two ardent suffragettes clad in khaki, motoring clothes and driving a little yellow Saxon roadster arrived in the city last evening about six o'clock. They started from New York City on April 6 and stopped at nearly all of the principal cities in the southern states.

They arrived in San Francisco on June 14 and started north and will make the return trip via Seattle and then east. Their car was covered with the names and initials of hundreds of men who had heard the arguments of the two women in favor of suffrage.

On the rear of the car was a large wooden key with the words "votes for women" painted thereon. After a short stop here inquiring the direction to Sutherland, they were on their way north.
