Coming to Roseburg upon a prom se of marriage, unable to locate the nan with whom she was in love and with an attempt made to swindle her out of her meager savings by a fraudulent real estate deal a woman today appaeled to the sheriff's office or assistance. According to her story she was living in California when she met the man to whom she is engaged. Shortly before the marriage coremony was to take place she became III and she was forced to go to the hospital and submit to an operation which kept her confined to her bed for several weeks. The man in the meantime had sone to Portland. Ore., to attend to business matters, leaving word for her to follow him as soon as she was able and that they would be married in Portland. She reached the Oregon metrop-

oll only to find a message telling her that he had come to Roseburg to ook after some timber interests which he held in Douglas county. She immediately came to this city and endeavored to locate him, but has not yet been able to do so.

Shortly after her arrival in this city an attempt was made to sell a homestead consisting of 126 acres of timber land located within a mile of Roseburg and within a short distance of a saw mill. The insistence of the real estate dealer that she invest her money in this gift edge proposition finally aroused her suspicion and he made inquiries which led to the disclosure that there was not a homestead within many nilles of Roseburg and that 120 acres of timber land were worth much more than \$300, the amount of money for which the land dealer was endeavoring to sell the piece of property.

Unable to secure assistance in any other way she today appealed to the officers. She says she will remain in Roseburg for a few days, as she not yet given up hope of locating the man with whom she is i love, but if she does not find him mon, she will go to eastern Oregon. where he has a brother living and will locate him by this method.

She has secured work and is supporting herself while remaining in this city.


