TIME FOR SPRAYING FOR BROWN ROT

Most Important to Control the Disease at This Time of the Year.

WET WEATHER BRINGS ROT

Importance of Applying Bordeaux Spray for Protection From Rot.

It is now time that all prune growers should apply the most important spray for the control of the brown rot disease of prunes. This spraying about one month before picking time is for the protection of the fruit against the most serious infection from this fruit disease as the fruit ripens, and it is therefore advisable that if any of the recommended brown rot sprays are omitted by the grower during the fruit season to never neglect applying this spray at the present time.

Bordeaux mixture should be applied at the summer strength of 4-5-5 when the stock solution is used, or the Bordeaux paste at the rate of 8 lb. to 50 gal. of water. For good results, it is important that the spray mixture should get a coating on all side of the fruit. While this is most easily accomplished by using a fine mist spray with high pressure, the Bordeaux used alone is apt to be washed off following a rain when protection is needed most, if the following sticker is added which increases the spreading as well as the adhesive qualities of the spray. The following formula for this purpose is recommended by the Oregon experiment station: Resin, 5 lb.; potash lye (same as used for washing purposes), 1 lb.; fish oil, 1 pint, and water 5 gal. Place this oil and resin in an iron kettle and heat until the resin is dissolved. Remove from fire and cool somewhat, then add the lye and boil over until the lye is added. The lye should be dissolved in a little water and the solution added slowly with stirring to the resin oil mixture. Place again over the fire, add the required amount of water and boil for an hour or more until the sticker will mix perfectly with cold water forming an amber-colored solution.

Use two pounds of this prepared sticker with fifty gallons of the diluted Bordeaux spray. This sticker cannot be used with ordinary lime-sulphur because of the chemical reaction which takes place. The beneficial results following the use of Bordeaux instead of lime-sulphur will be more fully appreciated by most growers when they consider its more adhesive qualities, and find that some fruit injury often results to prunes in foliage from lime-sulphur when it is used in a summer dilution as low as 1-4-9. Also at the present time, the price quotations on the local market of the blue stone for the Bordeaux mixture is much lower per pound than it was a few weeks ago.

The brown rot infection in orchards over the county is as heavy as it was last year at this time, and this year with a heavy crop of prunes which hang in clusters touching each other, thereby keeping the moisture on the prune from rapidly drying out from the morning sun, the opportunity is considerably increased for a larger percentage of infection. Last year the heaviest loss to the prune growers was due to brown rot, and was conservatively estimated at from 30 to 40 percent. With a much larger crop in prospect this year than for a good many years, the loss will undoubtedly be much more if this spraying protection is not generally used, especially in orchards where there has been a heavy loss due to this disease. The sooner this spray is given now before the early fall rain usually along the first week in September, the lighter will be the loss from this source. The successful grower must bear in mind that our recent light showers and misty cloudy mornings are weather conditions favorable to brown rot, as it is the number of damp days rather than the inches of rain-fall that actually determines the amount of infection.
