**Butter-Scotch**

Place, all together in a saucepan, two cups of granulated sugar, two tablespoonsful of water and a piece of butter the size of an egg. Cook, without stirring, for about fifteen minutes, or until a little dropped into cold water is hard and brittle. Pour into well greased pan and when newly cold mark into squares. Shelled wal nuts, almonds or pecans may be added to the butter-scotch just before it is turned into the cooking pan.
