New Rural Mail Boxes

This item of information is for the farmer boys. According to instruc-tions from Washington in regard to rural mail boxes, the farmer cannot buy an old style mail box and take it with him to a mark box and take it

with him to a new location. But he can take his own box with him. That is if a farmer changes his location and happens to need a new mail box, he is obliged to buy one of the new

style, according to regulations receiv site, according to regulations receiv-ed from Washington. This new ra-ral mall box must be made of gal-vanized from and there is a choice of two styles. One, just for letters and ordinary mall must be just 15 ½

inches long, 6 ¼ inches wide and 7 ½ inches high. The other must be 23 ½ inches long, 11 inches wide and 14 inches high, a size large enough for ordinary parcel post packages.


