**CANADA LOOKS AHEAD.**

The way in which Canada began to meet, and has continued to meet, the big problems immediately arising from the war has won the admiration of the world. In no less thorough and businesslike fashion it is preparing itself to face the inevitable readjustment and stress and competition that will follow when the war at last comes to an end. It knows that a tremendous task faces it when the props are taken out from under the present war order prosperity. The interest alone on its new war debt—which at the end of the present fiscal year will amount to a billion and a quarter, or about four times the national indebtedness when the war began—is a third of the total annual expenditures of the Dominion three years ago.

So Canada comes to the conclusion that instead of glib talk of the wonderful resources of the country it must prepare to give them prompt and adequate development when the war ends. To that end the government has appointed a council of scientific and industrial research, made up of eleven experts, specialists of achievement, and for several months that body has been working quietly but effectively in a way that is already showing results of far-reaching importance. The council has been making a survey of the resources of Canada, timber, mineral, fuel, oil, hydro-electric, etc., and an inventory of the present industrial and transportation agencies. It is already developing the Saskatchewan lignite areas and those of Alberta. It believes that in the latter province alone there are 60,000,000,000 tons of this mineral easily available for fuel for both domestic and manufacturing purposes. It finds another hope for the all necessary cheap fuel in the oil-laden shale of Ontario. It believes that it can supply the potash requirements of America, give the world far cheaper nickel and molybdenum and by its vast forests solve the pulp and paper problem for generations to come.

The council believes that the time for indefinite boasting is past and that Canada must now organize its resources for the use of the world. Beyond doubt we shall see quite another Canada after the war, one probably even more friendly than in the past and more willing to co-operate in things where co-operation is possible, but nevertheless a Canada that will come into its own, and a Canada that industrial United States will have to reckon with very seriously.

**A GOOD WAY TO SAVE.**  
 In encouraging the people of America to save it is believed that the liberty loan bonds are going to perform an important function in our national life. The small denomination of some of the bonds renders it practical for the ordinary wage earner to purchase one with the savings of a few months, and the banks of the country have undertaken to provide for the purchase of these bonds in small weekly or monthly payments.

By devoting each week or each month to the purchase of liberty loan bonds such little sums of ready money as are often frittered away for useless things one can not only acquire property that ranks among the very best securities in the history of the world, but can at the same time feel that a patriotic duty has been performed and a habit of saving acquired.

Of course the ultimate result of this war will be a victory for America, but what the effects of the war will be upon America and American people is unknown. When such an unknown future confronts us—produce demands that contingencies be provided for. An uncertain future is a time to be provided for. No one knows how great a help savings invested in a liberty loan bond may be a few years hence.

And your savings not only will be absolutely secure but will be constantly bringing in interest—an income absolutely free from taxation and absolutely certain.

There are other possibilities—they might better be called probabilities—and one is that the liberty loan bonds, when peace comes and money now in active industrial use will be seeking quiet investment, may bring a handsome premium.
