IGNORANCE IS NOT AN EXCUSE

Failure to Receive Notification Does Not Exempt You In Draft.

LEARN YOUR NUMBER

Every Registered Man is Requested to Keep Watch on Draft Day and if Number is Drawn to Appear.

Failure to receive a mail notification will not be accepted as an excuse for not appearing for examination for the selective draft, according to announcement just made by Adjutant General White and addressed to the local board.

After the draft is made all county boards will mail notification, he says to the men who have been called in their respective counties. These no-tices will direct the men to appear for physical examination at a date set which must be within seven days. But each man is expected to learn his serial number without delay so he will know at a moment's notice whether he is drawn.

Complete lists of the serial num-bers which are in red ink have been posted by each county exemption board. County clerks of each county have the data and can furnish the necessary information to all inquir-ers.

Men are cautioned to bear in mind that the numbers of their own regis-tration cards count nothing now that the numbers of all cards have been changed in the last two weeks. The new numbers are written on the cards in red ink.

When the first drawing is made in Washington, probably the week of July 23, the numbers drawn will be announced to the press and tele-graphed to the adjutant general who will consult the files in his office for the names of the men belonging to the numbers, and notify the county boards.

The bids for the Douglas county road bond issue of \$555,000 author-ized at the recent election will be opened in this city on July 28. The bonds will be issued in 10 instal-ments of \$55,000 each and the first installment will mature at the end of five years from the date of issuance. The entire series will be retired at the end of 14 years.

"ARMY BLUE" WILL NOT BE INCLUDED

Captain Buchanan, of the fourth company, has stated that "army blue" will not enter into war this year. The storied name of the "boys in blue" can not longer be used so far as service goes. The "blues" as dress uniforms are termed in army parlance, will be returned by the company commanders to the quar-termaster at Eugene and by him will be turned over to the United States disbursing officer. Any other prop-

erty belonging to the United States which will not be taken to war by the coast artillery will be returned to the federal government through the same channels.

Word has been received from Eugene to the effect that the allowance for feeding men while at their arm-ories after the call, and before mobil-ization at state or district rendez-vous, has been raised to 75c per day per man, where company officers have to go into the open market and buy rations. The allowance for ra-tions drawn from the United States stores continues to be 40 cents per man. In the past where it was neces-sary to feed men at restaurants, 75 cents per man was allowed, but when they bought the rations in bulk and company cooks prepared them but 40 cents was allowed. It is very prob-able under the new rule that nearly all of the companies will establish their cook mess at their local arm-ory.

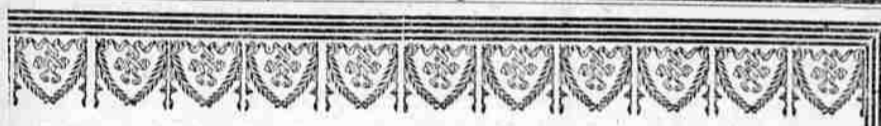
