

## IGNORANCE IS NOT AN EXCUSE

Failure to Receive Notification Does Not Exempt You In Draft.

### LEARN YOUR NUMBER

Every Registered Man is Requested to Keep Watch on Draft Day and If Number is Drawn

to Appear.

Failure to seceive a mail notifica-ion will not be accepted as an excuse for not appearing for examination for the selective draft, according to announcement just made by Adjutant General White and addressed to the

local coard.

After the draft is made all county boards will mail notification, he says to the men who have been called in their respective counties. These notices will direct the men to appear for physical examination at a date set which many hard here. which must be within seven days. But each man is expected to learn his serial number without delay so he will know at a moment's notice whether he is drawn.

Complete lists of the serial numbers which are in red ink have been posted by each county.

Men are cautioned to bear in mind that the numbers of their own regis-tration cards count nothing now that the numbers of all cards have been changed in the last two weeks. The new numbers are written on the cards in red ink. When the first drawing is made in Washington, probable the redi-

When the first drawing is made in Washington, probably the week of July 23, the numbers drawn will be anounced to the press and telegraphed to the adjutant general who will consult the files in his office for the names of the men belonging to the numbers, and notify the county beards.

### DOUGLAS COUNTY WILL SELL BONDS

The bids for the Douglas county road bond issue of \$555,000 authorized at the recent election will be opened in this city on July 28. The bonds will be insued in 10 installments of \$55,000 each and the first installment will mature at the end of five years from the date or issuance. The entire series will be retired at the end of 14 years.

Douglas quonty has an assessed valution of \$27,899,000. The net resources of the general fund are \$97,061, while the net resources of the road fand total \$61,341.

Delinquent taxes due from the Oregon and California grant lands amount to \$342,331.

### 'ARMY BLUE" WILL NOT BE INCLUDED

Captain Buchanan, of the fourth company, has stated that "army blue" will not enter into war this year. The storied name of the "boys in blue" can not longer be used to far as service goes. The "blues" as dress uniform are termed in army parlance, will be returned by the company commanders to the quartermaster at Eugens and by him will be furned over to the United States disbursing officer. Any other prop-

erty belonging to the United States which will not be taken to war by the ceast artillery will be returned to the federal government through the same channels.

Word has been received from Eugene to the effect that the allowance for feeding men while at their armories after the call, and before nobligation at state or district rendez, yous, has been raised to 75c per day per man, where company officers have to go into the open market and buy rations. The allowance for rations drawn from the United States stores continues to be 40 cents per man. In the past where it was necessary to feed men at restaurants, 75 cents per man was allowed, but when they bought the rations in bulk and company cooks prepared them but 40 cents per man was allowed.
