**POSTMASTERS ANSWER
LABOR QUESTIONS**

City men can be of value on farms during the two weeks of their vacation in picking operations, but they will not as a general rule, be of value in the heavier work. They will just about get hardened up when it is time for them to return home. Based on interviews with farmers, this is the opinion of 90 per cent of 125 presidential postmasters, throughout the state, from whom R. P. Bonham, head of the immigration service, sought information as to the labor needs and requirements in all sections of the state during harvest time, assuming that they are the best informed men in their locality. Mr. Bonham sent each one of the 125 postmasters a circular letter containing a series of questions and has received replies from 90 per cent. These records have been filed in his office for reference in dispatching labor to the various sections of the state.
