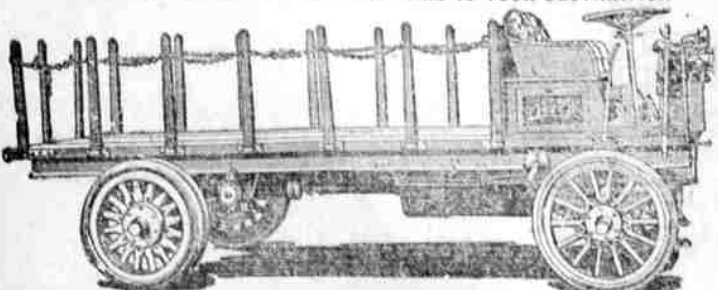

O. A. C. IS EXTENDED A NATIONAL HONOR

CORVALLIS, Or., Aug. 11.—According to a telegram received Friday by President W. J. Kerr, of the Oregon Agricultural College, that institution has been made one of the 15 distinguished military colleges in the United States.

There are 122 similar college eligible to compete for this honor, of which 15 have been placed in the distinguished class.

This entitles the president of the college to name 10 graduates of the 1917 class for commissions as second lieutenants, with no further examinations other than physical fitness.
