Three Hundred and Nine Men Have Been Recommended For Commissions.

SKILLED IN LUMBERING

Age Limits Bange From Twenty-five to Forty Years-Will Take Physical Examination Under War Department Bules.

It is anonunced by the forcet ser-vice that it has been able to com-ply in full with the request of the war department for assistance in securing qualified lumbermen and for esters to serve as officers for the for est battalions which are to comprise a part of the American overseas forces. Three bundled and nine men have been recommended for commissions in the grades of major, captain, first lieutenant, and second dentenant. Or these, two thirds are practical lumbermen or saw until operators and one third are trained foresters with long woods experience.
