The entire student body, one of the largest ever assembled on this or any

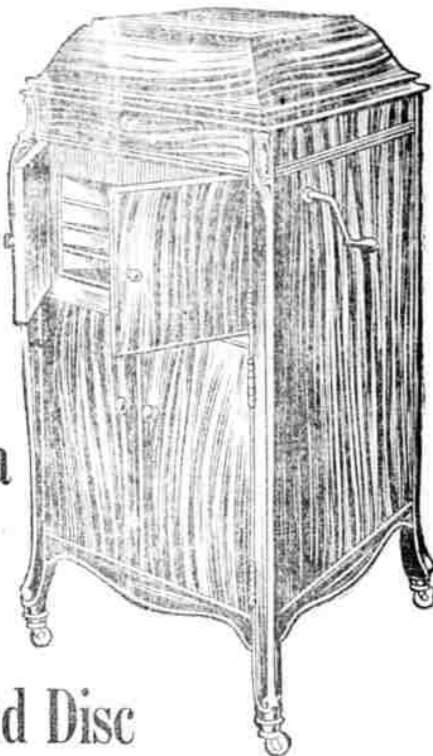
