## U. S. TO UTILIZE AUTO FACTORIES

### Output of Non-Essentials Curtailed and Plants Are to Supply War Needs.

### FIRST OF MANY DEMANDS

#### Conscription of Industries to Supply Army Needs Was Discussed by War Board and Auto Manufacturers.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—Conscription of industries to supply the needs of the army was discussed recently by the war industries board with automobile and accessories manufacturers, who pledged their full cooperation to the government in whatever is necessary to win the war.

The plan is to divert part of each plant to the production of war material. It was arranged to have the manufacturers represented in the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce and the motor and accessories manufacturers appoint a committee to work with the automobile products section of the war industries board in planning how the big automobile factories of the country can be of the greatest service.

The conference is the first of many to be held with makers of non-essentials as the necessities of the war makes greater demands on the country's resources.

All such industries probably will be called upon to fall in line behind the government in curtailing the production of everything not making a direct contribution to the nation's fighting efficiency.

Curtailed production of non-essentials was said to have been taken up first because of the manufacturers' voluntary offer of cooperation because of the highly organized nature of the industry and because the problem of utilizing raw materials used in the manufacture of automobiles had become serious to the automobile men.

The extent of the decrease in production probably will be very substantial, to be effected gradually as portions of the plants are diverted to the manufacture of shells, airplanes and other war necessities.

Particular attention was paid to the question of employing men now at work in factories whose products may be curtailed and it was said authoritatively that an action will be taken in any case until a definite plan has been formulated as to how the labor affected is to be employed in the home territory, thereby preventing costly and disorganizing migrations.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—The navy department is waiting for a report from Vice Admiral Sims concerning the trip before of the United States patrol vessel Albatross, sunk in the war zone Monday morning, with the probable loss of one officer and 20 men. The Albatross was a converted yacht, and the latest information of the disaster stated that she and its four destroyers were being struck by United States destroyers and were combining the ocean for miles around in hope of picking up survivors. Seventy-one of the 84 men aboard are believed to have been rescued.
