**AT THE ANTLERS TONIGHT.**

Geraldine Farrar in "The Devil Stone" creates the role of a simple Breton fisherwoman, removed after the early part of the story to America, as the wife of an unscrupulous millionaire owner of the fisheries. Silas Martin. The similarity of the man's name with that of Silas Marner, the miser of fiction, is particularly appropriate because Martin, who meets the fisher girl in Brittany whether he has gone to subdue his employees who are clamoring for higher wages, demonstrates his miserly impulses by marrying the girl in order to get possession of a valuable emerald which she has found along the seashore, and which, in her simple, superstitious belief is a relic of the legendary Queen Grenada, of Norse folk lore.

The underlying theme of the narrative, namely, the sinister effect of the world-old stumbling block of man, superstition, furnishes the basis for a story of interesting study, since it links with the ancient tale of Grenada a modern development of the curse placed upon the possessor of the Devil Stone, carried down into the events of the life of Marcella Mano, as a Breton fisher girl and later as the wife of Silas Martin in America. The picture, which was produced at the Antlers theatre last night, will be repeated tonight.
