PERMANENT RECRUIT STATION IN ROSEBURG

Uncle Sam has established a permanent enlisting office here, and it is in charge of Sergeants Leavitt and Allen. The latter gentleman has been in Roseburg for several days, and Sergeant Leavitt just came last night. They have an office in the Perkins block and will accept men between 18 and 49 for the army or navy who can pass the physical tests. Men between the ages of 18 and 36, regardless of the draft, so long as they have not been notified to appear for induction, will be accepted for the marine corps, while men from 18 to 21 and from 31 to 41 will be accepted for the army. Married men as well as single men are eligible. Provision is made by the government for dependents of married men, so that no one need hold back on that account. Second Lieutenant Potter will be here on the evening train to assist in induction of men who have made verbal contract.
