## GIRL FOUGHT FOR UNION IN UNIFORM OF SOLDIER

The fighting career of Bridget Murphy, an Irish lass who in the garb of a man served in the Union army throughout the Civil war, is the stirring narrative told and vouchered for by Dr. R. I. Law, of Galesburg, Ill., who is attending the G. A. R. encampment, says the Morning Oregonian. Dr. Law, who is a member of Galesburg Post No. 45, fought side by side with the woman who was so completely disguised that none of her comrades suspected her sex.

The girl worked on farms in New York and in the spring of 1862 she reached Sycamore, Ill., where she enlisted in an Illinois regiment then being recruited. Through the remaining three years of the struggle she fought and was even slightly wounded, but her sex was not discovered. To her fellow fighters she was John Casey, brave upright and a man's man.

In 1913 she was taken ill and became too feeble to work, so she entered the Illinois soldiers' home. Her sex was still unsuspected, but the secret was revealed when she became

mildly insane and was committed to the Watertown asylum. She died in 1916 and was buried in the soldiers' cemetery.
