WHAT HAVE WE WON?

(Four-Minute Speech by S. C. Bar-
trum.)

When this war drew the search-
light on our national life it revealed
to us conditions of an unbelievable
nature existing in our commercial,
and industrial life, in our educational
institutions, and in fact in almost
every vocation.

In our mad rush and race for for-
tune and success we have overlooked
the subtle influence that have been
working in our midst. We never ap-
preciated until the truth was forced
upon us that we were unconsciously
becoming the tools of a foreign po-
lice under an insidious propaganda.
We were drifting or rather being led
toward foreign ideals in music, art,
science and the higher education.

That most attractive, innocent ap-
pearing but subtle and destructive
German Bolshevism has been, thru
an insistent foreign propaganda, in-
noculated into the minds of a certain
element in this country, forming a
nucleus for active operation. Its ad-
herents have thrown a circle around
themselves and excluded everything
American. Its pernicious influence
has been eaten into the very vitals of
our industrial life, creating strife
and hatred between those factors that
should in wisdom be coordinating
their mutual interests for the benefit
of themselves and the public welfare.

Under the freedom of our laws, our
foreign population has in the past
been allowed unhindered and at its
own discretion to fraternize in dis-
tinctive groups throughout the land
and to exercise at its will foreign
thought, foreign language and for-
eign ideals. This has not been con-
ducive to good American citizenship
and American patriotism.

This war has taught the Ameri-
can people that from this time on
this must be stopped and instead
they must accept and cherish Ameri-
can loyalty, American thought and
American idealism. As certain as the
sun rises this will be done, for the
two million or more returning red
blooded American soldiers, who have
been in direct contact with these
causes and who will in the near fu-
ture assume largely the responsibility
and reign of our country will insure
this improved condition.

We have therefore won from this
war a higher standard of citizenship,
a broader and more comprehensive
understanding of our allegiance to
our flag and to our country.
