EFFICIENT METHOD FOR MARKETING LIVESTOCK

For the purpose of establishing a more efficient method of marketing of livestock and for the purpose of increasing live stock production in Douglas County, a joint committee of the Farm Bureau organization co-operating with the Pomona Grange has organized for the cooperative shipping of livestock, and have arranged with Mr. John Alexander to take charge of the same. Arrangements with Mr. Alexander is that he is to devote his entire time to promoting this work; that he is to assist in assembling the stock in car lots at shipping points; to accompany the shipment to the market and superintend the selling; making returns by check to the owners. The methods followed in this instance are the same as have been developed by the Bureau of Markets and Agricultural Colleges throughout the United States. Mr. Alexander will receive for his services 20 cents per hundred pounds on all livestock shipped. This and the necessary freight and stockyard charges will be the total expenses of shipping the livestock. Mr. Alexander has established an office in Roseburg where he can be reached either by mail or telephone. It is earnestly hoped that the farmers of the county will give this method of marketing a thorough trial as it has proven very economical in other sections of the State, and only needs the hearty cooperation of the farmers here to make it a success.
