**Divorce is Obtained.**  
Ben A. Dowell obtained a decree of divorce from his wife, Myrtle Dowell, at a hearing of the case before Judge Hamilton, Saturday. John T. Long represented the plaintiff. The decree was obtained on the grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment and misconduct on the part of the defendant.

**Figures Got Twisted.**  
An error appeared in the article on Walnuts in last evening's edition of The News, giving the yield per tree in Mr. W. C. Hardings eight year old orchard in Garden Valley at 13 pounds. **Funeral Tomorrow.**

**J. P. Wheeler Passes.**  
Word was received here yesterday that J. P. Wheeler, formerly secretary-treasurer of the Southern Oregon Conference of S. D. A., who left Roseburg about two years ago, died of influenza at his home near St. Helena, California, a few days ago. Mr. Wheeler is survived by his wife and three little children. His mother was first taken ill with the pestilence and died, and it is thought, he contracted it while assisting in caring for her.

**Wm. Pemberton's Sons Ill.**  
Dr. B. R. Shoemaker made a professional trip last night to the home of William Pemberton, who lives beyond Brookway, where the doctor is treating the two sons of Mr. Pemberton, William Jr. and Ed. Pemberton. The former returned a short time ago from Camp Lewis, where he had just recovered from an attack of influenza, and shortly after his arrival here was taken ill with mumps and following this attack of illness was stricken with pneumonia. Ed. Pemberton is ill with the mumps. Both young men are reported as improving.

**A Wet January.**  
The average rainfall for the month of January during a period of 41 years is 5.79 inches. During the present storm, which began last Thursday night, the full quota has been made up, and more than three inches of water has fallen, and this morning the total is more than a quarter of an inch above the normal. Almost a half inch of rain fell in the 24 hours ending at 5 o'clock this morning, being the total for the month up to 5.37 inches. Indications are that the storm is not over, and probably this present January may become one of the real wet ones in the list.

A new method of computing charge on telephone toll calls under which all toll calls throughout the United States are placed on a standard basis, has been announced by the post.

master general of the United States and will become effective today. Toll calls will be divided into two groups—"station to station" calls, where the person calls only for a number and not for a specific person; and "person to person" calls, where the person asks for some particular party. The rate for the latter service is one-fourth greater than the "station to station" call rate which is determined by the air line distance between toll points and is computed on the basis of 5c for each 6 miles, up to 24 miles, and 5c for each 8 miles beyond this point.

Extra charge will be made in the case that the person being called cannot be reached by telephone within one hour, the exact address not having been given. This charge is called the "report charge" and is also made when the calling party is absent or will not take when the connection is made within one hour. The "report charge" will not be made if the call is completed on the day filed. This charge is to cover compensation for the operating work and is usually about one-fourth of the "station to station" rate.

Special charge is also made where a messenger is required to bring the person wanted to the telephone. The rate for this service is usually about one-half greater than the "station to station" toll rate when the messenger fee. "Appointment" rate is charged when the person calling sets a specific time at which he will talk to the person being called. This rate is the same as the messenger call rate less the messenger fee.

Reduced rates for night service on the "station to station" basis only are as follows: 8:30 p. m. to midnight—about one-half the "station to station" day rate; midnight to 4:30 p. m.—about one-quarter of the "station to station" day rate.

### DODGE BROTHERS HAVE BIG PART IN WINNING THE WAR

After war was declared the United States government started to manufacture the type of heavy artillery used by the French. The guns were called the 155 millimeter howitzer and the 155 Millimeter Filoux rifle. They had never before been manufactured in America. A certain recoil or recuperating apparatus was required for these guns, but this mechanism had never been built here. The problem involved the gigantic task of constructing a special plant and the designing and making of special machinery and tools, with the greatest possible speed.
