The drive for the Armenia and Syrian Relief Fund, ends on Saturday evening, March 29th, 1919, and there has been no response to the call for volunteers to canvas Roseburg. This city must be active from now until the end of the drive. Good reports are coming in from many outside districts that they will equal or go beyond their quota of last year.

Douglas county is still several hundred dollars behind with her quota. This should not be. What is the cause of this indifference of the people in this drive? The patriotism and generosity of her people should not be less now than formerly. Is it because the war is over? But, the responsibility that we assumed to help the Allies has

not ceased. We must not shirk our duty. Our charity is not confined to our country. During the great war our vision broadened to assume a world responsibility for the welfare of all civilized nations. But, many of our people believe in withdrawing from Europe and letting the nations thereof settle their own affairs in their own way. That may be the flagging cause in the Armenia. In spite of that fact, however, we should give something and give now to relieve their present distress and sufferings.

Therefore, now is the time for those who have not sent in their contributions to do so before it is too late.

With pardonable pride let it be said that Douglas County has heeded the urgent appeal for those starving people, and that she has again gone "over the top."
