Ralph Quine, of the Tax Department, left this morning for Yoncalla to spend the day attending to business matters.

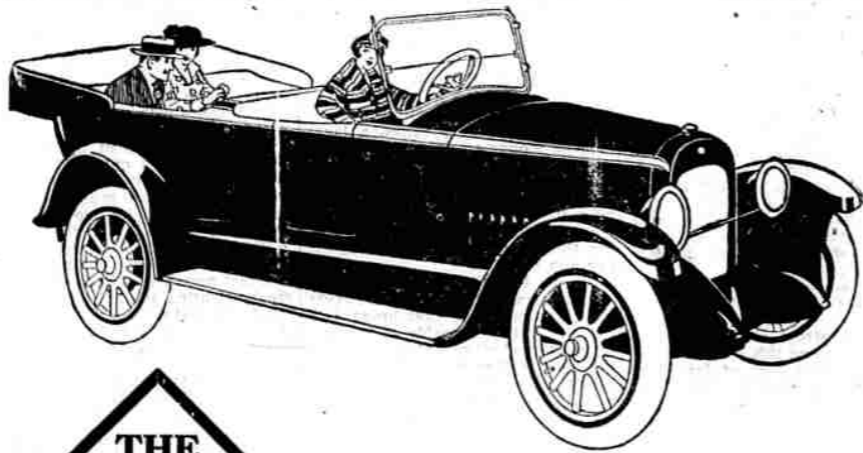
