THE SAFEGUARD OF LIBERTY.

It used to be the habit of shallow-minded wits to remark at a close of a session of congress, "congress has adjourned and the country is now safe." But in May, 1919, the country felt great relief when congress was called into special session. With all its faults, and they are neither many nor serious, congress is the bulwark, the safeguard, the last citadel of representative government. In its structure and its specified powers, congress was designed to be and is the branch of government which distinguishes our form of government from an absolute monarchy. No intelligent man who attempts to think for a moment will fail to realize that congress, in the full possession and exercise of its constitutional prerogatives, is all that maintains in these United States government of the people, by the people, for the people. Glance back over the record for the past six years and see the numerous instances in which an executive or his subordinates have attempted not only to dictate the enactment of law but to substitute their own varying whims for law itself. If congress had acquiesced in executive direction of legislation, or if congress had given assent to usurpation, conditions in this country today would be little different in practice from conditions in a nation where no legislative body exists. Even in the face of such self-assertion as congress had been able to make, we have had dictatorship to an alarming degree. No one man, however great or good, is either good enough or great enough to rule his fellow men. No one man's judgment, however sound, can be safely followed in preference to the judgment of 531 men chosen from every walk of life, from every section of the country, and representing all shades of political, economic, religious and social opinion. Despite the cheap attempts at wit at its expense, the United States congress is the greatest and most dependable governmental agency on the face of the globe.

Woodrow Wilson has accepted an honorary citizenship in Switzerland. Perhaps he imagines that this will help some in his aspirations for president of the world. Indeed, since Mr. Wilson has deemed it a "profound pleasure" to accept this Switzerland honor, The News is quite sure that a majority of the loyal people of the United States will wish him God speed in his efforts to run the Universe, because in that self-constituted capacity he will bother America less.

The United States senate is patriotically endeavoring to undo the damage sustained to the principles of democracy by Woodrow Wilson "acting in his own name and by his own proper authority" as the sole individual to represent American ideals in the peace council.

A great rain, this but the weather man will have to kindle a little more fire if he expects to round out a bumper crop of fruit in this county.

And they are going to rewrite the peace treaty. This is not the beginning of the end—only the first step backward.
