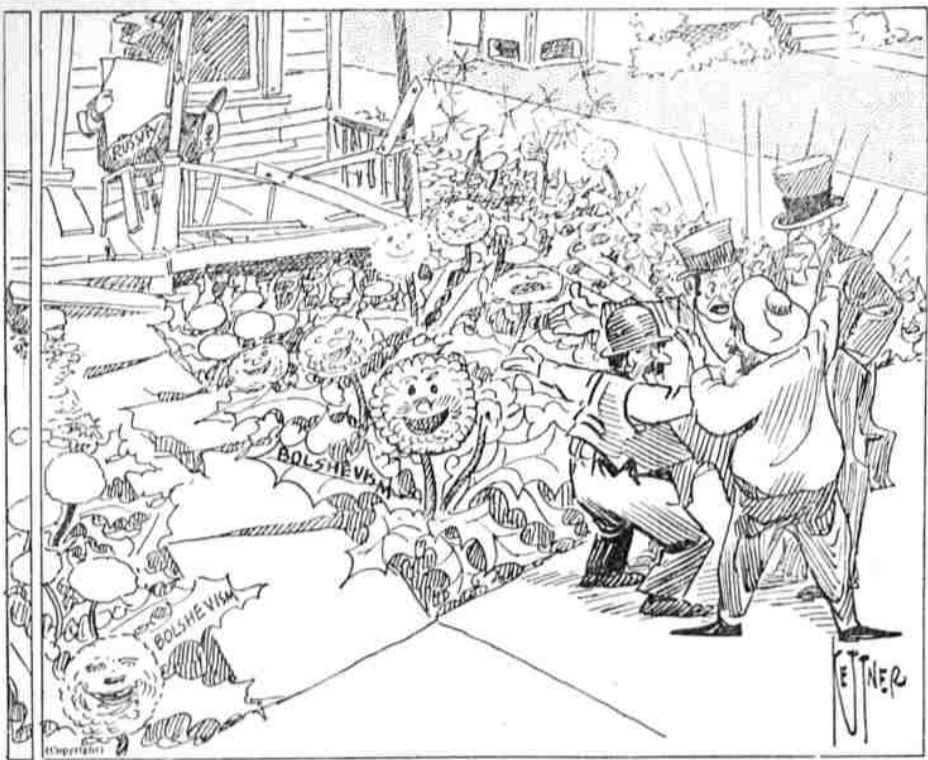

When their demands were refused by diocesan officials the priests stopped celebrating masses and religious activities at the resort ceased.

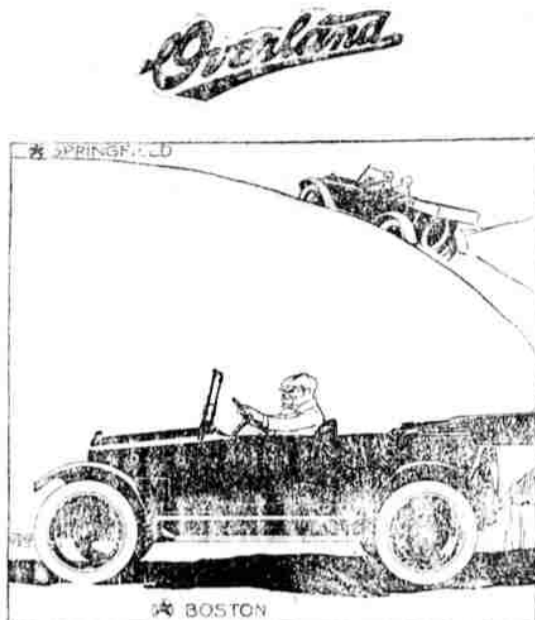
