The work involves approximately 7 1/3 miles of regrading and graveling. The limits being more particularly described as from the east end of the road at Stephens School House, west of Central Avenue, Sutherlin, to point which bears S. 64 degrees 23 1/2' W. 741.26 feet distant from the 4 corner between sections 3 and 10, Twp. 25-4.

Highway Construction Douglas County, Oregon. Sealed bids will be received by the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, at the Court House, Roseburg, Oregon, at 2 o'clock p. m., on the 12th day of July, 1919, for construction work on a section of road between the city of Sutherlin and the Stephens School House, west of said city.

The work involves approximately 4 miles of re-grading and graveling. The limits being more particularly described as from the railroad crossing in the city of Sutherlin to the east end of the east approach to the bridge that spans the Calapan Creek at the Stephens School House.
