**ALLIES PAY PRICE.**

WASHINGTON, July 15.—During the debate on the peace treaty terms and league of nations today, Senator Lodge, republican, of Massachusetts charged that awarding of Shantung

Peninsula, a portion of Chinese territory, to Japan, was the price paid for Japan's signature to the league of nations, with robbing of China as the consideration. Lodge asserted that there is no statute of limitations that runs against a great wrong like that. The foreign relations committee began reading and discussion of the treaty today, deferring consideration of the league covenant. The reading will occupy several days.
