BRITISH COAL MINE CLOSED BY STRIKE

(By Associated Press.)

LONDON, July 24.—Sailors are keeping the coal mines free from water due to the strike in the Yorkshire district, and troops are protecting the men from attack by the strikers. The government has stopped exportation of Cardiff coal.

SAW MILL DESTROYED. MEDFORD, July 24.—The Gagnon lumber mills on the outskirts of the city burned today entailing a loss of \$25,000. T. J. Gagnon, proprietor of the plant, believes that the fire is work of an incendiary. He will rebuild the mill immediately.

GRAIN FIELDS BURNING. PORTLAND, July 24.—Fires in the wheat section near Pendleton have destroyed over thirty thousand dollars worth of standing grain in that vicinity. The wheat was fully covered by insurance. There are no

dangerous forest fires in the state at present time.

FOREST FIRES QUENCHED. MISSOULA, July 24.—Heavy rains during the past few hours have greatly improved the forest fire situation in Montana and Idaho.

COMMISSIONER IS LOST. SALEM, July 24.—A. C. Barber, recently appointed state insurance commissioner by the Governor, to succeed Harvey Wells, resigned, is lost in the mountains near Breitenbach Hot Springs, according to word received here at the commissioners office. The telegram announcing the man as being lost was from Detroit. In the eastern part of Marion county, and asks that searching parties be sent out from Salem. Mr. Barber has been missing since Tuesday. State fire wardens and others are already searching for the missing man. Mr. Barber was taking a vacation before assuming his duties.

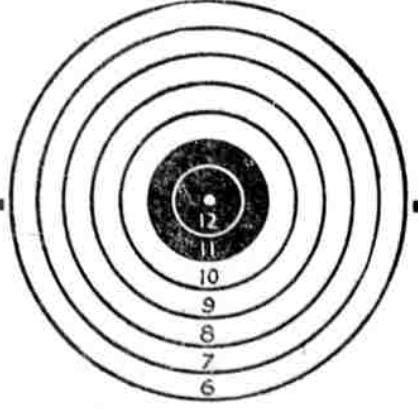
