WRECKED PLANE IS COMPLETELY REPAIRED

After making the necessary re-
pairs to their plane which recently
was wrecked when a cross air cur-
rent turned them into a fence in the
North Roseburg landing field, R. A.
Reed, and C. E. Pangborn, of St.
Maries, Idaho, left today for their
destination. The propeller arrived
this morning, having been delayed
for several days, and as all other
repairs had been made, the avia-
tors were in the air after about an
hour's work. They spent a few mo-
ments at a low altitude testing out
their motor and the strength of
their wings and then climbed up to
a good height. After testing the
repairs the pilot turned the plane
into several loops and performed a
great number of thrillers for the
crowds watching him. He flew over
considerable territory around the
city and then returning flew low
over the business district distribut-
ing advertising for the Antlers Thea-
tre. He then went to the Hannan
Field from which place he made the
start for Eugene.
