## SOLDIER LECTURER TO BE HERE SUNDAY

Lamar Tooze | Will Speak On War Experiences at The Antlers Theater.

WAS MEMBER OF 91st

Served With Famous "Wild West" Division During Twenty-seven Months of Service in the U. S. Army Overseas.

First Lieut. Lamar Tooze, the Oregon boy who served with the 364th Infantry of the famous "Ninety-first," "Wild West," division throughout the time that the division was in France and Belgium, will speak at the Antlers Theatre, August 24, giving an account of his experiences as a soldier of twenty-seven months overseas and has observations of the present international situation, gained while attending the Sorbonne, Paris, for four months following the signing of the armistice. Lieut. Tooze formerly lived in Polk county and his lecture is attracting much attention there. He will speak in Roseburg, Medford, McMinnville, Pendleton and La Grande.

"I am very proud to know that I was a member of the Ninety-first division," declared Lieut. Tooze while recounting some of his experiences at the Multnomah hotel. "It is known throughout the expeditionary forces for its aggressiveness in attack and its stubbornness in the defense. Unquestionably it saw more action, advanced a greater distance and took more prisoners for the time that it was overseas than any other division of the A. E. F. We were engaged in three major operations from September to Nov. 11. We advanced 34 kilometers and took 2300 prisoners. In the Argonne battle there were altogether 22 di-

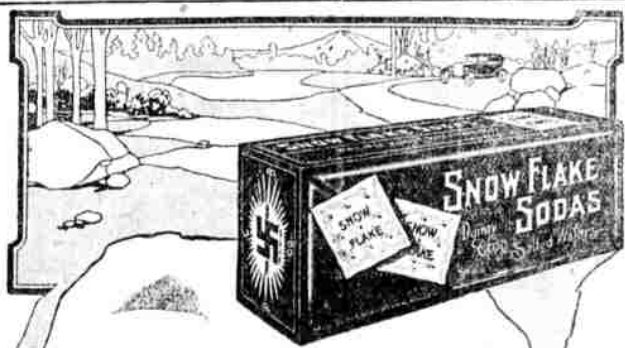

## TOURISTS NOTIFIED THAT ROAD IS OPEN

The National Parks Highway Association issues a weekly bulletin giving conditions of automobile roads throughout the country. In their last issue regarding conditions of the roads from Portland to San Francisco they have stated that the road through the Canyon in Douglas County was practically impassible; that cars could only go thru after 5 p. m., and on Sunday. There seems to be considerable propaganda sent out through the country encouraging the tourists to travel the Eastern Oregon route. visions engaged during the operation which lasted from Sept. 26 to Nov. 11. Fifteen thousand prisoners were taken by the Americans during that period and of this number 2240 were captured by the Ninety-first—roughly one seventh of the total.

"What does it feel like to be in battle?" Lieutenant Tooze was asked.

"That is a hard question to answer because not all people are affected the same way. But generally speaking, it is quite a matter of fact event. The only pace that you see the color sergeant leading the assault, waving the American flag, is on the front covers of the popular magazines. There is no romance in war any more. Those days passed with the Rough Riders' charge at San Juan Hill. It is a cold business affair. I have yet to see a man who, as a general condition, was scared. However, I do not think there was anyone who has been under fire, but who was temporarily frightened when a shell or bullet came too near for comfort. There is much fatalism of the battlefield. Time and time again, I have heard this expression: 'If I am going to get it, I will get it, that's all.' And it is true that shells and bullets are not choosers of persons.

"The average doughboy fears shells more than he does bullets. This is due to the blood-curdling noise they make while traveling through the air. But shells are less dangerous because one usually has time to drop to the ground and unless it lands too near, he is practically safe."
