## VERDICT PLEASURES FRUIT GROWERS

Decision of Supreme Court Of Washington is Victory For Northwest Men.

## HAD MUCH LITIGATION

Pears Which Were Basis of Suit Were Shipped From Roseburg in 1917 and the Case Has Been in Court 1 1/2 Years.

Fruitgrowers are well pleased by the victory won by the Umpqua Valley Fruit Union in the Supreme Court of Washington. It marks the passing of the day when fruit was held as the darling of the speculator and puts it on a firm, substantial basis as a commercial commodity. The affair started in 1917 when W. C. Harding, a pioneer in the fruit industry of Douglas County, shipped several carloads of pears to C. A. Malbone, sales agent for the Northwestern Fruit Distributors. These pears, it was later shown in the court proceedings, were sent from place to place by the agent, who made little effort to dispose of them, until they were finally of no commercial value and were disposed of at a ridiculously low figure. The fruit union brought suit to collect the balance between the price for which the damaged pears were sold and for what they would have brought had they been properly managed and a judgment for \$2500 was given in the Circuit Court, where Attorney B. L. Eddy represented the plaintiff. The company then appealed the decision of the lower court and after a year and a half of litigation the matter was brought to a close when the Supreme Court affirmed the decision.

The fact that the pears were recognized as removed from the speculation circle is very pleasing to growers who now have a greater assurance that their crops mean real and not possible money to them.

Mr. Harding is still in the pear business and is getting results. On a ten acre field at Winston, he has already gathered 70 tons of Bartlett pears, of which only 2 1/2 tons were under a heavy two in size. This is a remarkable record that can be surpassed or even equalled in very few sections. Even after this showing the trees are still well loaded with great quantities of fruit of an equal size.

## AIRPLANE MAN HERE.

B. W. Craig, with the Medford Aircraft Corporation, arrived in this city yesterday to make arrangements with local merchants to bring their airplane here for commercial flying. It is the plan of Mr. Craig to bring the plane here on Friday evening and make flights carrying passengers on Saturday and Sunday. A charge of \$15 for each flight will be made and every passenger will have a good opportunity to give the city and valley the "once over."
