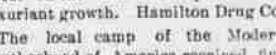

Prof. Sawyers is widely known as an entertainer of great merit, and promises to sustain his reputation as such on the evening above mentioned.

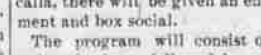

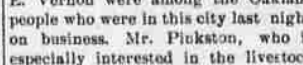
