While the play is built exclusively on comedy lines, some of the situations being broadly humorous, still it contains a neat little rebuke to those worthy, but narrow minded people, who, knowing nothing whatever of the theatre or its methods, believe it to be an institution of the Evil One, and all actresses and actors his allies.

Southern Pacific trains are still tied up at Duasmuir, Calif., by the big slide at Cantara, a few miles north of there. The slide is 200 feet long and is in a narrow gorge in the Sacramento Canyon.
