Glendale News.

Glendale narrowly escaped a disastrous fire Sunday morning. Caused by a defective terracotta flue, fire broke out in Mrs. P. R. Miller's dwelling house and but for the prompt action of the bucket brigade, no doubt more than one building would have gone up in smoke. It is Mrs. Miller's intention to tear down the old building next week and erect a new one on the same site.

Angus McQueen and Clark Taber, the well known Portland mining men, accompanied by Albert Geiser, the most prominent mine owner in Eastern Oregon, arrived here Monday and next day proceeded out to the Gold Bug mine, 15 miles southeast of Glendale, on which property they recently took a bond, and in which a fabulously rich strike was made this week of ore that will run thousands of dollars to the ton. Mr. Geiser about six years ago sold the famous Bonanza mine near Sumpter for \$750,000, and still owns a number of valuable mines in that district. Only last week he took a bond on the Oregon King mine in Crook county for \$400,000. It is the intention of these mining magnates to make the Gold Bug one of the greatest mines in the West within a short time—and they have the energy and capital with which to do it.—News.

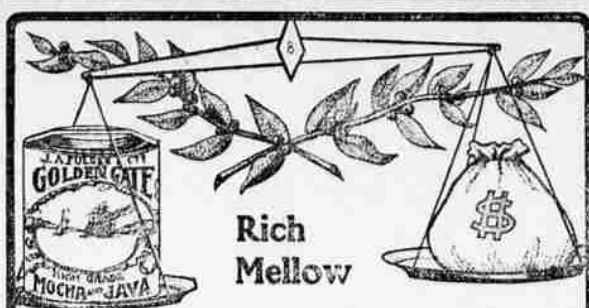
