WINE OF CARDUI

To Suppress Lawlessness.

SALEM, Ore., May 13.—Governor Chamberlain sees no means of suppressing lawlessness on the range in Lake county except through the efforts of the people of that county. The Governor has been indisposed for several days and has been confined to his room, but read with deep regret the accounts of wholesale sheep killing near Lakeview. On his return to his office today he was asked whether state authorities can do anything to prevent similar outrages in the future.

"I do not think any one man can successfully attempt to bring the offenders to justice. The men who were guilty of killing sheep by the hundreds are rough men, whose manner of life has made them reckless and they will shoot with slight provocation. A district attorney can do nothing to bring them to account.

"The trouble seems to be due entirely to local conditions and local influences," he replied, "and I think local people must find a remedy. There is no law authorizing me to offer a reward for the arrest of the men who committed the offenses.

"I think that an organization of law-abiding citizens, formed by men who will stand together, might be effective. They could offer a reward and give the officers of the law assurance of loyal backing in their work. Such an organization would arouse public opinion and make it easier to find the guilty persons. One or two men cannot do anything working alone."
