NO CHANGE NEEDED.

Springfield News: The second Judicial District comprises Douglas, Lane, Coos, Benton, Lincoln and Curry counties. It is the largest district in the state of Oregon.

The position of Circuit Judge in this district is a very important one. The trust imposed is one involving the rights of the citizen. The Circuit Judge has a deeper hold than any other official upon the purse string of the taxpayers. His administration may be characterized by uselessly expensive terms of court, or it may be that which is considerate of the interests of the people. In a word his administration may help to lighten the burden of the taxpayer or increase it. Judge Hamilton is our present presiding Judge. He has made a record and of that we shall speak without a tinge of partisanship. The position is in no wise political, and so the people regard it. What evidence has he given that his administration has been in the interest of the people? Let us examine: In the first place there have been numerous important criminal trials in this district which were vigorously contested and appealed to the Supreme Court, notably the murder case coming from this county of the State against Branton. A mistake upon the part of the Judge and a reversal by the Supreme Court would have entailed upon this county \$5000 additional expense, and we find upon inquiry that during his term there has not been a reversal of any criminal cases tried before him. This is perhaps due to the experience which the Judge had while serving this district as district attorney. We also find that his record in the Supreme Court as to the cases appealed from his decision is not excelled by any judge within the state. His record therefore as to ability and impartiality in the administration of the office must be conceded to be all the most critical could desire. Speaking of this and understanding how vitally every citizen is interested in the position of Circuit Judge of this district, we ask the question, do the people desire any change in our judiciary?

Is it wise or good management in the name of politics to disregard the fact that Judge Hamilton, in addition to the ability which he brought to the bench in the first place, is now fortified by the experience of one term? We predict that such an administration of an office non-political will receive an endorsement at the polls regardless of politics. It is not necessary to say anything of Judge Hamilton's opponent, but what is known of him would not single him out as especially well fitted for the position. I have become a settled maxim with the people to recognize the faithful public servant, and in matters

pertaining to our judiciary to maintain its non-partisan character.

Thos. E. Bledsoe, the popular candidate for sheriff, was in town this morning. He had numerous friends in this county at the time of his nomination, and his acquaintance has been largely increased since, gaining him a correspondingly greater number of supporters. Mr. Bledsoe has demonstrated his ability to successfully manage his own business affairs, thus giving assurance that the public business will be handled in the same careful, able and obliging manner. He is also cool headed in emergencies, having had extensive dealings with all classes of men. His good judgment, fairness and honesty have won their confidence and esteem. Therefore he will be generally endorsed for the important office of sheriff by men of all parties because they will serve their own best interests by voting for him.
