Death of Mrs. A. Mahoney.

Mrs. Sophia Grace Mahoney, wife of Arthur Mahoney, proprietor of the Roseburg Soda Works, died at her home in this city this morning, June 14, 1904, of consumption. While the announcement of her death is received with deep regret by her numerous friends and acquaintances, it occasions but little surprise as she has been hopelessly failing in health for several months, and during the past few days her death had been expected at any time.

Mrs. Mahoney was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Carroll, of this city, and was born in Roseburg twenty-six years ago. She has resided here all of her life and in her death Roseburg loses one of its best known and most highly esteemed ladies. Besides her husband and parents, Mrs. Mahoney is survived by two brothers, W. H. and Shellah Carroll, and a sister, Miss Faye Carroll, all of this city.

The funeral will be held from the Presbyterian church in Roseburg, Wednesday, at 2 o'clock p. m., with services conducted by Rev. W. S. Smith, of Oakland. Interment will take place in the Odd Fellows' cemetery.
