Growing More Independent.

EDITOR REVIEW: Since the election I have frequently met intense republicans that claim that the republican party showed themselves less partisan in their voting than democrats. Now while I commend them for raising above party to defeat objectionable candidates on their ticket, I do not think that the majorities of the several candidates, as shown by the official returns, proves the assertion to be true. It is true we elected two democrats in the county, Mr. Coshow and Mr. Agee, and our circuit judge, although a democrat, carried the county by 800 majority. While all candid democrats will admit that they were elected by republican votes, candid republicans will have to admit that a number of republican candidates had their majorities greatly augmented by democratic votes. Mr. Coshow was nominated on the democratic ticket against Mr. Marsters, nominated by the republicans. Mr. Coshow's majority was 272, but Mr. Marsters had become very unpopular with an element in his party, whether justly or not I can't say. I have no criticism to make. But as the average republican majority was say 550, Mr. Coshow, owing to his great popularity and eminent fitness for the place, overcame this majority and won by 272 votes. Mr. Agee's majority was, I think, 512. His war record no doubt helped him greatly. But how about the republican treasurer with 935 majority, the assessor 809, school superintendent 1088, surveyor 905, coroner 1165, to say nothing of us having practically endorsed Mr. Brown, Dist. Atty., and Mr. Young, commissioner? I am not intensely partisan myself and hail this as a hopeful sign of a broader and more liberalizing sentiment in the county that will enable men to get away from their political prejudices and hoist them to a more independent plane of thought and action. When the time comes that we vote for men on their merits instead of for their party zeal we will have better officials to serve the county's interests. R
