Workmen are employed in clearing out the great piles of drift in the creek bed to prevent unusually high water during the coming winter.

Several days ago papers were signed giving the right of way for the flume by property owners between this place and Drain. On the 25th inst., they were also signed on the part of the company, and the matter is ended to the satisfaction of all.

Considerably over one mile of the flume has been completed, and the work will be more rapidly pushed now that the work is out of heavy timber.

Roseburg School Matters

In order to determine the amount of water power necessary to operate the ventilating fan at the new Roseburg High School, a test will be made at the school with the motor used at the Douglas County Creamery either next Wednesday or Thursday. On the basis of the result obtained from the test the Umpqua Water, Light & Power Co. will submit a price for furnishing power. In case the school directors consider the figure too high, they will probably decide to install either a steam or gasoline engine. Electric power is out of the question as the company submitted a figure of \$25 per month and the directors considered it more than the district could stand.

In addition to the foregoing, the school board at its last meeting fixed the following rates of tuition: High school, \$12 per year; lower grades, \$9 per year. An order will be made that the state law in regard to vaccination must be carefully observed.

As janitors, the former janitor, John Ratey, will be transferred to the new High School building and Mr. Carmony will be employed at the public school building. School will be opened at both places on Sept. 12th.
