Death of Mrs. G. W. Kruse.

Mrs. Alfarata Kruse, wife of G. W. Kruse, the well-known groceryman, of Roseburg, died at her home in this city early Sunday afternoon, Sept. 18, 1904, of uraemic spasms, accompanying an impending accouchement. She was 35 years of age. Previous to the day of her death Mrs. Kruse had been in her usual health. Sunday morning she was attacked with spasms and physicians were summoned. Shortly after noon the child—a girl—was safely delivered. Twenty-five minutes later, Mrs. Kruse was seized with another spasm and expired. Despite the adverse conditions of birth, the child is apparently healthy and thriving.

Mrs. Kruse was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John R. Kennedy, of this city. Besides her parents and husband she leaves seven children—three sons and four daughters—to mourn her loss. A fifth daughter died a few years ago. Mrs. Kruse is also survived by two brothers and a sister: Vade Kennedy, an S. P. brakeman, of this city; Jas. Kennedy, a farmer, living near Williams, Josephine county, and Miss Luella Kennedy, of Portland. Miss Kennedy arrived from Portland this morning.

Mrs. Kruse was a member of Lilac Circle, No. 49, Women of Woodcraft, and of the Christian church, from where the funeral will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with services conducted by Rev. Geo. C. Ritchey; interment will occur in the Masonic cemetery.

Mrs. Kruse was a very estimable lady and highly respected by all who knew her. The bereaved relatives have the sympathy of all in their hour of sorrow.

Larger Sleeping Car Berths.

One of the few railroad companies that owns and operates the sleeping cars in service on its lines, is the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul.

The sleeping cars on this line were formerly Pullman cars, operated by the Pullman Company, but for a dozen years past the railway company has owned and operated the sleeping car equipment. In building its sleeping cars, a departure from the old standard pattern of cars has been made to the extent of adding about six inches to the width and height of the sleepers. This permits of wider and higher berths. Length has also been added to berths, so that comfort is found in them which is lacking in ordinary sleeping cars. These large cars are in service on practically all of the lines of the St. Paul road, and are very popular with the traveling public.
