General News.

Jealous because he thought he had been supplanted in the affections of his parents, a boy 24 years old, of Nyack, N. Y., killed his one-month old sister Wednesday as the baby was sleeping in its cradle. The boy used a statuette as a weapon, fracturing the infant's skull. The verdict rendered by the coroner was that the baby was killed by her brother, whose tender age makes him irresponsible for the deed.

Jacob Casteline, 67 years old, of Passaic, N. J., has not closed his eyes in sleep for 20 years. Ability to do so was permanently destroyed by intense worry over doctor bills for his wife, who is an invalid.

Fire in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Wednesday, destroyed \$800,000 worth of business property.

Many able bodied men in Chicago, who were thrown out of work by strikes, are now hiring out as house servants. The average salary of a servant is \$30 a month and found.

Nearly all telephone girls employed by the Pacific States Telephone & Telegraph Company, in Portland, went on a strike Wednesday on the ground that two of their number had been discharged without just cause. After a tumultuous scene and an hour's conference, the girls returned to work, under condition that the company take back the girls who were "fired" but the employees all agreed to work until 10 o'clock that evening, when a meeting was held and formal demand was presented to the management for better treatment of the young women employed in the telephone exchanges in that city.
