OREGON CITY, Or., Nov. 15.—While hunting this morning with an older brother at their home near Highland, Tracey, the 15-year-old son of Samuel McSherry, was shot and seriously wounded. In crossing a field, the two brothers became separated for a distance of about 50 yards.

Attracted by the flight of a flock of birds, the older brother, who was not aware that his brother was not beside him, turned and excitedly fired several of the charge of birdshot striking Tracey on the upper part of the forehead and, glancing, produced slight scalp wounds. One of the stray shots entered the right eye near the nose and may cause the injured boy the loss of the eye.

General News.

The dead body of a 2-months-old baby was found in a lake seven miles north of Salem, Ore., Saturday, in a sack weighted down with stones. There is no clue to the identity of the murderer.

The Missouri State Building at the World's Fair was destroyed by fire Saturday entailing a loss of about \$200,000. One fireman was killed and two others were fatally injured.

Secretary of the Navy Paul Morton on Saturday gave out estimates for the appropriations necessary for naval establishment for the coming fiscal year. The total is \$124,530,635, as compared with \$97,158,190 appropriated for the present year.

The statue of Frederick the Great, the gift of the emperor of Germany, was unveiled at Washington, D. C., Saturday.

At Honolulu Saturday, Dan Renear established the world's record in a 100-yard swimming race, going the distance in one minute flat.

While the city was yet in the throes of a teamster's strike, 6500 tailors in Chicago walked out Saturday because the employers refused to sign an agreement providing for closed shops and a union wage scale.

Robbers held up the ticket wagon of Farepaugh & Sell's circus at Lorboro, N. C., Saturday and secured \$30,000.

Louis Buena, who was convicted of felonious assault upon a young woman about a month ago while in a boat on Monterey Bay, Calif., has been sentenced by Judge Smith to 90 years in the State Penitentiary.

Col. Wm. C. P. Breckinridge, of Kentucky, died Saturday from a stroke of paralysis sustained Wednesday. He attained the rank of colonel during the Civil War and afterwards served several terms in congress. He was a principal figure in the noted Breckinridge Pollard scandal.
