WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 7.—Henry B. Miller, of Oregon, American Consul-General at Nanchang, China, is in line for promotion to a more important position in diplomatic service, and it is expected his promotion will soon be announced by the State Department. During his service in the Orient Mr. Miller has made a splendid reputation, and stands high with the State Department.
Two places are under consideration, though it has not been determined to which, if either, Mr. Miller will be appointed. These places are the Consul-Generals at Shanghai, China, and Kobe, Japan, two of the most desirable diplomatic posts in the Orient.
