District Attorney Geo. M. Brown is engaged in investigating the case of Nelson Elsen, the old man who was found dead near the cabin on his homestead near Comstock, on the 20th of last January. W. H. Miller, of Cottage Grove, who also owns a homestead near Comstock, is held in jail here charged with poisoning Elsen, the complaint being sworn to by Elsen's widow.

Arsenic or strychnine is believed to have been placed in the coffee pot out of which Elsen had drunk on the day he was found dead. Examination of the coffee grounds failed to disclose any evidence of poison, but Mrs. Elsen, not satisfied, had the stomach of the deceased removed for analysis, the result of which has not yet been announced. Suspicion attaches to Miller because his brother had trouble with Elsen over land matters.
